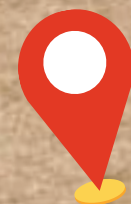

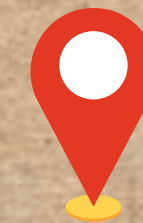
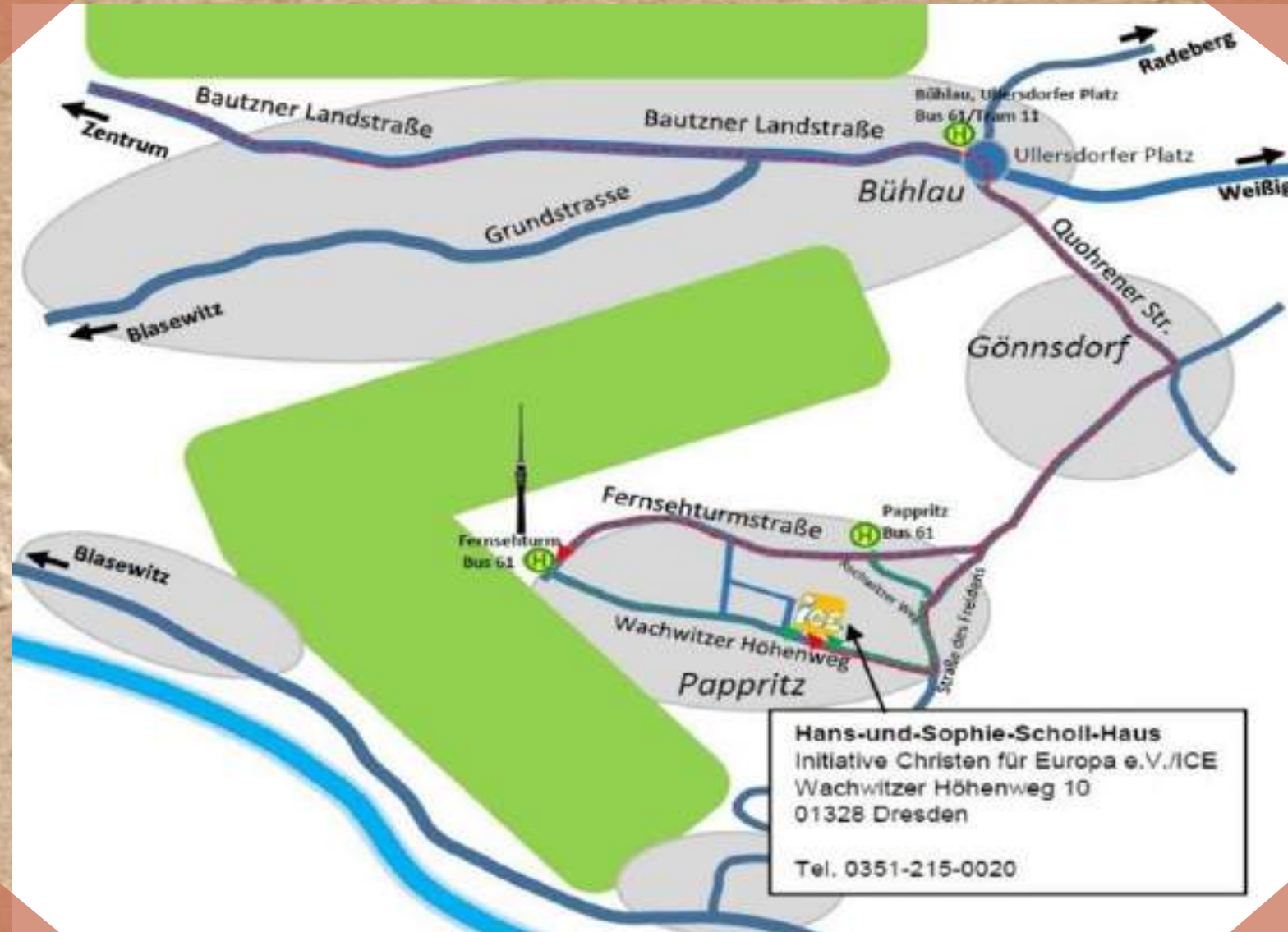
# About the project:

**You can reach the venue by train or long -distance bus as follows:**

**Dresden-Hbf or BF Dresden-Neustadt (cheaper). In both cases tram 11 towards Bühlau (final station). From there by bus 61 towards the television tower. Rochwitzer Weg/Pappritz stop. Cross street into the Rochwitzer Weg. Then turn right into the street Friedens. After approx. 100 m turn right again into the Wachwitzer Höhenweg - again after about 100 m the Hans and Sophie Scholl Haus (a total of approx. 6 minutes footpath, alternatively to the end of the television tower. There in the Wachwitzer Höhenweg: approx. . 8 minutes footpath.)**

**The participants will stay in 3 or 4 bed rooms. Each room is equipped with its own shower/toilet. The cooking will be organized together with participants.**

The target group for participants are local citizens and intercontinental migrants living in Europe who are interested in learning about and promoting European culture and identity. The participants will be selected from six different countries and will be a total of 60 individuals. Additionally, the participants should be interested in disseminating information about European culture and identity to other intercontinental migrants living in Europe. After the activity, participants will organize an event in Leipzig and meet with German parliament deputies who work in the Ministry of Culture to ask questions and gain insights into the intersection of politics and culture. Finally, participants will create an Instagram page to share the results of the project and useful information about European culture for three months, and group leaders will monitor the page and collect dissemination statistics.
